In the United States Court of Federal Claims

GENERAL ORDER

In accordance with updated guidance from the Administrative Office of the United States Courts, and considering Zoom for Government has received a FedRAMP Authorization to Operate (ATO), I DIRECT that, effective immediately:

- Judicial officers and court employees may use Zoom for Government on Federal judiciary resources, including on court networks and on court-issued laptops and devices.
- Iudicial officers and court employees may use Zoom for Government for court proceedings, for professional-related conferencing, and for internal conferencing needs.
- The Clerk of Court is directed to provide public notice of this Order and to take any necessary actions to implement this Order, including modifying relevant firewalls and issuing a summary of best practices to judicial officers and court employees who elect to use Zoom for Government.
